CONSTITUTION AND RULES.



1. The Club shall be called "THE SHEFFLETON HARRIERS."

2. The Club shall be devoted to the promotion of Athletics, and particularly to the prosecution of Cross Country Running during the winter months.

3. The Office-Bearers shall consist of President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Captain, Vice-Captain, and Seven Members of Committee. Five to form a quorum.

4. The Annual General Meeting shall be held early in September each year, at which the Secretary and Treasurer shall submit their Annual Reports, and the Office-Bearers and Committee shall be elected by Ballot after Nomination. A General Meeting shall also be held in April.

5. Secretary to be authorised to call a Meeting of Committee at any time.

6. Special General Meetings may be called at any time, should the Committee deem them necessary, or on a requisition, signed by 12 Members, being presented to the Secretary, accompanied by a statement of business.

7. Two Auditors, not members of Committee, shall be appointed at the Annual General Meeting to audit the Club Books and Accounts for the year.

8. The Membership of the Club shall be strictly confined to Amateurs, according to the definition of

the Scottish Amateur Athletic Association, which is as follows:—"An Amateur is one who has never competed for a money prize, or monetary consideration, or for any declared wager or staked bet; who has never engaged in, assisted in, or taught any athletic exercise as a means of pecuniary gain; and who has never taken part in any competition with anyone who is not an Amateur."

9. Applicants for Membership must receive the written recommendation of two Members, one of whom must be of the Committee, and shall be admitted, provided the majority of the Committee agree.

10. Members shall be divided into two classes:—(1) Life, (2) Ordinary. Members who have paid five or more consecutive Subscriptions may become Life Members on application to the Committee.

11. Subscriptions shall be payable as follows:—Life Members, 10/6; Ordinary Members, 2/6 per annum, due 1st October each year.

12. Any Member intending to withdraw from the Club shall give written notice to the Secretary before or at the General Meeting, at which meeting the Roll shall be read, and all on the list held liable for their Subscription.

13. No Member shall compete at any sports which are not held under the laws of the S.A.A.A. or S.C.U., or other recognised governing body, and any Member infringing may be expelled from the Club.

14. Any Member violating the Rules, or guilty of any misconduct, may be expelled from the Club by the vote of two-thirds of the Committee. The expelled shall have a right to appeal to a General

Meeting called at his request, not later than 14 days from the date intimating expulsion.

15. The Club Uniform shall consist of Dark Blue Singlet, with Gold Band and monogram in centre, and Dark Blue Knickers.

16. The Committee shall have full power to make, alter, or annul Bye-Laws.

17. The Committee shall have full power to fill up any vacancy which may occur in the Committee or Offices of the Club during the year.

18. No alteration in or addition to the Rules shall be made excepting at the yearly General Meeting, and unless supported by two-thirds of the Members present. Notice of the proposed alteration must be made, in writing, to the Secretary, on or before 15th August.

19. In the event of a Competitor winning the Championship and Handicap he shall only take one prize.

20. That no Member shall be allowed to run in any Handicap promoted by the Club, or to represent the Club in any race until his annual Subscription has been paid.

21. The Handicap Committee shall consist of five Members, to be elected at the Annual General Meeting.

22. No Third Prize will be given in any event unless there be nine or more competitors.

BYE-LAWS.

1. That all Members shall obey the orders of the Captain, or his deputy, at Club Runs.

2. That at all runs the Club shall be under the control of Pace Makers and Whips, who shall be appointed by the Captain or Vice-Captain; and no Member shall be allowed to go ahead of the Pace Makers, unless it be a racing run, or the signal be given for a race home. The Pace Makers shall bring up the pack when requested to do so by the whips.

3. That every Member of the Club is expected to wear the Club Uniform at the Club runs, and to support the Management for the time being.

4. To qualify for any of the Handicaps, Members must previously have taken part in three Saturday Runs.

5. That the Committee have power to admit new Members at any Saturday run, such admission to be subject to confirmation at the first following General Committee Meeting.

6. That the Committee have full power to declare a race void in the event of the trail being lost.

7. Entry Fees for all Handicaps promoted by the Club, 1/-, or three together, 2/6.

8. A Prize (other than a medal) will be given for the Member having the largest number of attendances at Club Runs.

9. Weekly Subscription, 2d, for stripping accommodation.

10. All entries for Handicaps must be in the hands of the Secretary at least four days previous to the Race.

NOTES FROM 9TH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE CLUB.

The Cross-Country Season opened at Eastmuir School, on 5th October, 1912, and continued till 29th March, 1913, there being 24 runs, with an average attendance of 28.4, the highest attendance being 52.

Inter-Club runs were held with the following Clubs:—Bothwell, Clydesdale, Garscube, Hamilton Y.M.C.A., Manachline, Monkland, Motherwell Y.M.C.A., Olympic, Springburn, and West of Scotland Harriers.

The various Races throughout the year resulted as follows:—

Five Miles Novice Championship.—Novice Champion—Andrew Semple. Handicap Result—1st, William Cameron; 2nd, Alex. M'Glashan.

Five Miles Open Handicap.—1st, John M. Hannah; 2nd, Andrew Semple; 3rd, Alex. M'Glashan.

Six Miles Road Race.—1st, Thomas Ritchie; 2nd, William Scott; 3rd, Charles S. Fisher.

Club Championship and Seven Miles Handicap.—Club Champion—Andrew Semple. Handicap Result—1st, Robert H. Macadam; 2nd, Harry Stafford; 3rd, John Strain.

In the Clydesdale Harriers' Team Race we were unplaced, as we failed to finish a Team. John Strain, however, was 3rd in the Handicap, finishing 19th in the Race. In the Western District Championship we finished 10th, our first man home being Andrew Semple who was 7th.

Three Members, namely—John M. Hannah, James Wallace, and Andrew D. Shaw, had a complete attendance at the runs.

The following are the Members who were successful at the various Sports during the Track season:—
