SHETTLESTON WIN EDINBURGH-GLASGOW

THE thirtieth Edinburgh to Glasgow relay race on November 21st, sponsored by "The News of the World", was not the fastest of the series because of strong headwinds but from the beginning it was a classic duel between two teams evenly balanced in talent and experience.

Craig Douglas put Edinburgh Southern ahead of Shettleston by 8 seconds on the first stage and although Dick Wedlock made early inroads on Fergus Murray on the second leg, the Edinburgh man drew away again to keep the gap at 7 seconds at the changeover. Shettleston's Tom Patterson pulled in his man within a mile but Southern's Coyle refused to go behind, and Gareth Bryan-Jones and Norman Morrison took off together, matched stride for stride throughout stage four and passed over the batons with a nominal one second in Southern's favour.

But on stage 5 Henry Summerhill, a great servant to Shettleston, swung the balance, racing away from former Scottish mile record-holder Graham Stark and handing over a lead of nearly a minute to Lachie Stewart. It looked decisive, but 10,000 metres hero Stewart was surprised on this 7 miles-and-a-bit stage by marathon man Don Macgregor, who made up ground on his formidable opponent. Southern's Martin Craven cut the arrears still further to send Ken Ballantyne away just 17 sec. behind Bill Scally. A terrific come-back for Southern was in prospect when Ballantyne bridged the gap but the effort was too much and Scally drew away again to cross the line 80 yards ahead.

The battle for the bronze was another tale of two cities, with the issue clearly between Victoria Park and Edinburgh AC by stage two. The Glasgow club painstakingly built up a lead of over a minute by stage six and then saw Jim Alder not only wipe this out but put Edinburgh AC ahead by a similar margin. Schoolboy David McMeekin, making his bow in this event, was understandably tentative at first but later swooped on his man and caught him at the last changeover. EAC's Fairgrieve and Victoria Park's Meredith ran shoulder to shoulder until Alexandria Parade, where the Glasgow man opened a gap which he steadily increased to 100 yards at the finish.

That club of ancient lineage, Clydesdale Harriers, were fifth and won the award for the most meritorious performance of the day.
