CENTRAL BOX EDINBURGH TO GLASGOW RELAY

TOM HANLON emerged from a nine-month absence to inspire Mizuno Racing Club to a ninth straight victory, *Fraser Clyde* reports.

The Olympic steeplechaser hadn't been in action since finishing fifth in the national cross country championships. But there were few signs of rustiness as he put his club on the road to victory with a sparkling performance on the third leg. He was, surprisingly, the only Mizuno runner to achieve a fastest stage time.

But Mizuno captain Alan Robson celebrated his 40th birthday by anchoring the side to a success which leaves them two short of

Shettleston's record.

Shettleston had to settle for the silver medals yet again. It's the 14th time they have finished second in the big race and the club has now placed among the top three on no fewer than 30 occasions.

Hunters Bog Trotters, the brown-vested mischievous rogues of the Scottish athletics scene, collected bronze for the second time in four years although Ronhill Cambuslang made a valiant but vain attempt to overhaul them on the final leg.

Colin Youngson maintained his own remarkable personal association with the event by taking part for the 30th time since 1966.

Stage One (5.5M)

STEVE CAIRNS gave McDonald's Carnegie Harriers a brief spell of glory as he led home the invited field of 22 clubs. Cairns powered home with an advantage of almost 100m over Mizuno's John Ross while Shettleston's John Mackay was a further 100m down in third place just ahead of Cambuslang's Dougie Runciman.

Stage Two (6.6M)

TRADITIONALLY this is one of the stages in which the top clubs bring out their big guns and that made life particularly hard for Carnegie's Stevie Ogg, who slipped from pole to ninth.

Graeme Wight raised Shettleston's hopes of a first victory since 1976 by edging home four seconds in front of Alex Robertson of Cambuslang. Ken Chapman dropped Mizuno down to third while national cross country champion Bobby Quinn produced the fastest time of the stage, and missed the course record by just four seconds in lifting Kilbarachan.

Stage Three (4.7M)

TOM HANLON, who claims not to be doing any speedwork in training, was only persuaded to run a few days before the race. He then turned in a performance that took Mizuno 600m clear.

His run totally eclipsed the fine effort by veteran Tom Anderson who put Kilbarachan into second. Another old campaigner, Charlie McDougall, kept Cambuslang in the medal hunt while at the other end of the age spectrum Andrew Lamoncello showed his potential with the third fastest time of the stage.

Stage Four (5.3M)

MIZUNO's Max Colligan could afford to give ground to many of his pursuers without seriously affecting his club's chances of retaining the *News of the World* Trophy. Tommy Hearle made a valiant effort to keep Kilbarachan's interest alive by clocking the second fastest time on the stage but still trailed by more than 250m at the changeover. Graeme Coll and Stuart Gibson matched times as Cambuslang and Shettleston battled for third and fourth while Trotters' Ian Harkness was quickest of the lot.

Stage Five (5.5M)

SHETTLESTON'S Adrian Callan made a valiant effort to close the gap on Mizuno's Mike Carroll by clawing though to second place some 58 seconds off the lead but well clear of Kilbarachan.

Stage Six (7M)

The longest leg attracted its usual star-studded turnout. Glen Stewart added another minute to Mizuno's healthy advantage.

But his performance was up-staged by HBT's Phil Mowbray who blitzed over the undulating route in the fastest time of the day for the second year in a row. He hauled his side to less than 50m behind second placed Shettleston.

Stage Seven (5.5M)

STUART CAMPBELL kept Mizuno comfortably ahead although his former clubmate Frank McGowan - a member of the 1993, 1994 and 1995 winning Racing Club squads - ran the second-fastest stage time for Shettleston.

The battle for bronze turned in Kilbarachan's favour as Alex Muir produced the quickest time of the day to overhaul the Trotters.

Stage Eight (5.4M)

MIZUNO birthday boy Alan Robson had few worries. George Kirk held onto second place for Shettleston while Gary Brown worked hard to put HBT in the bronze medal position despite a magnificent final effort from Cambuslang's Charlie Thomson who closed to within 40m while Kilbarachan slipped out of contention.

PHOENIX RACES Preston Park, Brighton

ERIC KIPLAGAT had a serious go at Steve Ovet's long-standing course record of 21:01, but faded in the second half, *Martin Duff* reports.

Forced to press on alone from 3km, Kiplagat was beginning to fall behind the schedule passing Ovet's statue for the third time and wound up 41 seconds down on the 1993 record.

When Ovet set the record, in the inaugural race, there were at least 20 inside 23 minutes and Kiplagat would only have come fifth, behind Ovet, Peter Standing, athletes' manager Kim McDonald and Clive Hensby.
