## RELAYS AND EXCHANGE STATIONS

The runners, totalling 160, will be divided into eight relays of 20.

Each competitor must wear, **BACK AND FRONT**, the number and the letter shown in this programme.

*News of the World* arrow signs will be shown throughout the Course at all turns, and banners show each take-over.

- FIRST RELAY.** Starting from the John C. Dunlop Memorial Fountain in Inverleith Park, run straight ahead down main drive, through Park Gates turning left into East Fettes Avenue; then right into Comely Bank, Craighleith Road to Queensferry Road. Continue along Queensferry Road to Barnton roundabout, turning left down Maybury Road to join Main Glasgow Road at Maybury Cross. First take-over. Distance 5½ miles.

- SECOND RELAY.** Main Glasgow Road, left fork to Newbridge, over stone bridge, under viaduct, right fork by Broxburn A.A. box to Broxburn East U.F. Church. Distance: 11½ miles.

- THIRD RELAY.** Main Road to Uphall, right fork, sharp rise to Dechmont (switchback going) to Wester Dechmont Farm. Distance: 15½ miles.

- FOURTH RELAY.** Main Road right fork, then fork left for Bathgate, over level crossing to Armadale (Clock Tower). Distance 21¼ miles.

- FIFTH RELAY.** Main Road, Blackbridge, over railway bridge, Forestfield Station to Forestfield Hotel. Distance: 26½ miles.

- SIXTH RELAY.** Main Road, Hillend, Caldercruix, under railway bridge, Plains, Clarkstone, Airdrie, Alexandra Street, Airdrie War Memorial. Distance: 33½ miles.

- SEVENTH RELAY.** Main Road, under railway bridge, Coatbridge Greyhound Enclosure, Bank Street, Coatbridge, Bargeddie P.O., Bailieston, Spring Hill Cross, Barrachnie, Telephone Box. Distance: 39½ miles.

- EIGHTH RELAY.** Main Shettleston Road, Shettleston, right fork, under railway bridge, Duke Street, turn left into High Street, turn right into Ingram Street to the Stirling Library (formerly Royal Exchange) Queen Street. Full distance: 44½ miles.

## DERBY WIN IN RELAY DRAMA

**D**OMINIC KEILY, 23-year-old railway clerk and one of six famous athletic brothers, provided the sensation of yesterday's record-breaking News of the World London to Brighton national road relay. Keily, taking over 25 yards behind international half-miler Peter Kilford of Portsmouth on the 12th and last stage, raced away to score a tremendous victory for his club.

Their time of 4hr 23min 42sec for the 54 miles, 1,341 yards slashed the previous best put up by Thames Valley four years ago by 5min 32sec.

Portsmouth, a gallant second, Bristol an incredulous third and Coventry, superbly fourth, were also inside the previous record.

It was one of the greatest races in the whole series, which date back to 1924. Six intermediate course records were set up. It's true there was a strong following wind, but the standard of performances has never been higher.

From the eighth stage when Martin Hyman took Portsmouth into the lead for the first time, the battle between the Southern favourites and Derby, out for their fourth consecutive victory, never let up.

Mike Bullivant put in a tremendous run on the ninth stage, to peg back Pompey's Bruce Tulloh. But it was far from over yet.

Mike Deakin forged further ahead only for Brian Lillicrap to restore Portsmouth to the fore on the 11th stage with another record-breaking effort. Then the scene was set for that exciting last leg between Keily and Kilford.

One of the biggest surprises was the third placing by Bristol. Their star, Eddie Strong, put in a tremendous run on the fourth stage to establish a new intermediate course record.

Man who gained honours on the sixth stage was Terry Stacey (Thames Valley). And on the seventh it was Portsmouth's Clive Plumpton who broke the old figures.

Despite Bullivant's wonderful performance on the vital ninth relay of 6 miles 52 yards, it was Coventry Godiva's Brian Kilby who broke the old record with 27min 23sec. Bolton United Harriers, who finished sixth, gained the medals for the most meritorious performance.

#### INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPETITORS AND OFFICIALS

A letter from the Rt. Hon. Sir John Greig Dunbar, LL.D. Lord Provost of Edinburgh, addressed to Mrs. Jean Roberts, the Rt. Hon. Lord Provost of Glasgow, will be handed to the first representative of Shettleston H., (last year's winners) at the start by Bailie Norman F. McQueen of Edinburgh, and will be delivered to the Lord Provost of Glasgow's deputy, Bailie Mrs. A. Bell at the winning post.

All teams will carry a baton throughout the race. (i.e. in the hand)

Any team falling 30 minutes behind the leading team will be taken out of the race.

Competitors' coaches, numbered as per relays 1-8, will take runners to their respective starting points, and pick them up again at the end of their relays. All competitors *must* travel in the official coaches.

All competitors, except those running the first relay, must be in their respective coaches, ready to start at 11.0 a.m. No competitor will be waited for. Only competitors and officials with Coach Tickets will be allowed to travel in the coaches.

To avoid congestion, no coaches must stop within 100 yards of each Take-Over. Coach drivers are asked by the Organisers to observe this request strictly.

The first ten teams to finish will qualify for next year's race. The remaining teams to be invited will be selected by the Scottish A.A.A. and S.N.C.C.U.
