## RELAYS AND EXCHANGE STATIONS

The runners, totalling 160, will be divided into eight relays of 20.

Each competitor must wear, BACK AND FRONT, the number and the letter shown in this programme.

*News of the World* arrow signs will be shown throughout the Course at all turns, and banners show each take-over.

- FIRST RELAY.** Starting from the Fettes College Gates in Carrington Road, run straight ahead turning right into East Fettes Avenue; then right into Comely Bank, Craighleith Road to Queensferry Road. Continue along Queensferry Road to Barnton roundabout, turning left down Maybury Road to join Main Glasgow Road at Maybury Cross. First take-over. Distance 5½ miles.

- SECOND RELAY.** Main Glasgow Road, left fork to Newbridge, over stone bridge, under viaduct, right fork by Broxburn A.A. box to Broxburn East U.F. Church. Distance: 11¼ miles.

- THIRD RELAY.** Main Road to Uphall, right fork, sharp rise to Dechmont (switchback going) to Wester Dechmont Farm. Distance: 15½ miles.

- FOURTH RELAY.** Main Road right fork, then fork left for Bathgate, over level crossing to Armadale (Clock Tower). Distance: 21¼ miles.

- FIFTH RELAY.** Main Road, Blackbridge, over railway bridge, Forestfield Station to Forestfield Hotel. Distance: 26¼ miles.

- SIXTH RELAY.** Main Road, Hillend, Caldercruix, under railway bridge, Plains, Clarkstone, Airdrie, Alexandra Street, Airdrie War Memorial. Distance: 33¼ miles.

- SEVENTH RELAY.** Main Road, under railway bridge, Coatbridge Greyhound Enclosure, Bank Street, Coatbridge, Bargeddie P.O., Bailieston, Spring Hill Cross, Barrachnie, Telephone Box. Distance: 39¼ miles.

- EIGHTH RELAY.** Main Shettleston Road, Shettleston, right fork, under railway bridge, Duke Street, turn left into High Street, turn right into Ingram Street to the Stirling Library (formerly Royal Exchange) Queen Street. Full distance: 44¼ miles.

# 1963 National Relay Race (London-Brighton)

## IT'S LUCKY 13 FOR COVENTRY IN OUR RELAY

Reprinted from the News of the World, 7th April, 1963

**COVENTRY GODIVA HARRIERS** scored their first-ever victory in the News of the World London to Brighton National Road Relay yesterday.

It was the 13th in the series. Having already won the national cross-country team championship last month, Coventry thus completed a magnificent double.

The winning time of 4hr. 26min. 15sec. was over 2½min. slower than the record set by Derby and County last year. But there was a strong head wind for most of the 54½ miles.

Derby, winners of the race for the past-four years finished second 42sec. behind, but well ahead of leading Southern club, Portsmouth A.C.

### THRILLING

Coventry started the race brilliantly with young Dick Taylor handing over 12 seconds ahead of Belgrave Harriers, Derby were then sixth and Portsmouth 13th in the field of 20 teams.

On the second stage Dominic Keily, one of the three Keily brothers in the team, carried Derby into the lead for the first and only time in the race. Coventry slipped to fifth place, though only 13sec. behind the leaders, while Portsmouth moved up to seventh.

Basil Heatley (Coventry), the English cross-country champion, lost 6sec. to his old rival Martin Hyman (Portsmouth), but such was their pace over the third leg that they took their clubs into first and second places respectively.

In the eighth stage Pompey slumped to fourth, and Juan Taylor opened a 41sec. advantage for Coventry after a ding-dong struggle with track international Eddie Strong (Bristol), who finally was forced to drop behind with stitch.

In the final stage John Hammond held off Alan Taylor (Derby) to win by 250 yards. Birchfield Harriers won the award for most meritorious performance.

### INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPETITORS AND OFFICIALS

A letter from the Rt. Hon. Duncan M. Weatherstone, M.C., T.D., Lord Provost of Edinburgh, addressed to Peter L. Meldrum, the Rt. Hon. Lord Provost of Glasgow, will be handed to the first representative of Motherwell Y.M.C.A. H., (last year's winners) at the start by Bailie T. McGregor of Edinburgh, and will be delivered to the Lord Provost of Glasgow's deputy, Bailie T. Fulton at the winning post.

All teams will carry a baton throughout the race. (i.e. in the hand).

Any team falling 30 minutes behind the leading team will be taken out of the race.

Competitors' coaches, numbered as per relays 1-8, will take runners to their respective starting points, and pick them up again at the end of their relays. All competitors *must* travel in the official coaches.

All competitors, except those running the first relay, must be in their respective coaches, ready to start at 11.0 a.m. No competitor will be waited for. Only competitors and officials with Coach Tickets will be allowed to travel in the coaches.

To avoid congestion, no coaches must stop within 100 yards of each Take-Over. Coach drivers are asked by the Organisers to observe this request strictly.

The first ten teams to finish will qualify for next year's race. The remaining teams to be invited will be selected by the Scottish A.A.A. and S.N.C.C.U.

Immediately after the race, competitors and officials with Tea Tickets adjourn to the Ca'doro Restaurant, Union Street, Glasgow, for High Tea, where Bailie T. Fulton will present the Trophy and Medals to the winners.
