RELAYS AND EXCHANGE STATIONS

The runners, totalling 160, will be divided into eight relays of 20.

Each competitor must wear, BACK AND FRONT, the number and the letter shown in this programme.

News of the World arrow signs will be shown throughout the Course at all turns, and banners show each take-over.

- FIRST RELAY.** Starting from the Fettes College Gates in Carrington Road, run straight ahead turning right into East Fettes Avenue; then right into Comely Bank, Craigleith Road to Queensferry Road. Continue along Queensferry Road to Barnton roundabout, turning left down Maybury Road to join Main Glasgow Road at Maybury Cross. First take-over. Distance 5½ miles.

- SECOND RELAY.** Main Glasgow Road, left fork to Newbridge, over stone bridge, under viaduct, right fork by Broxburn A.A. box to Broxburn East U.F. Church. Distance: 11½ miles.

DRAMA AS GODIVA WIN TITLE

AFTER 60 seconds of drama and sensation, Coventry Godiva Harriers won the News of the World London to Brighton National Road Relay yesterday, clocking 4 hours 19 minutes 34 seconds for the 54 miles 208 yards course run over 12 stages.

They beat Portsmouth A.C., second in 4-21-37, with Derby & County A.C. third in 4-21-50, and Belgrave Harriers fourth in 4-24-12.

The minute of drama and anguish came at the end of the newly arranged fourth stage of six miles from Wallington to Merstham.

International John Cooke, of Portsmouth, finished an heroic and exhausted second behind Coventry's famous Basil Heatley, only to find that his 22-year-old team-mate John Reynolds was not on the spot to take over the baton for Portsmouth.

Apparently Reynolds, inexperienced and running in his first ever London to Brighton race, was warming up some distance away from the take-over mark. Only after frantic calls and shouts from officials was the poor bemused Reynolds found, a full minute later, and frantically took up the chase.

In fairness to Coventry, however, it must be stated that this incident did not affect the result.

The winners went into the lead on the second stage through a superlative run by Bill Adcocks, who in clocking 23 min. 37 sec. for the 5 miles 249 yards set up a new intermediate course record. From then on, they never let up and indeed were never in danger of being headed.

Despite the appalling conditions of sleet, rain and bitter cold, no less than four new intermediate course records were established. On the fifth stage Roger Mathews, of Polytechnic, picked up six places to take his team into the lead for a short period, and in clocking 20 min. 26 sec. clipped a second off the old record.

Belgrave Harrier's star was Gerry North, who on the eighth stage, established a new record with 28 min. 19 sec.

No less than three runners beat the old record on the eleventh leg, the fastest being A. E. Johnson of North Staffs., who clocked 19 min. 35 sec., compared with the 19 min. 41 sec., put up by Brian Lillicrap, of Portsmouth, two years ago.

George Horne, of Coventry, clocked 13 min. 10 sec. for the sixth stage and David Cooke, of Portsmouth, was 18 sec. inside the old record on the final 3½ miles into Brighton on the twelfth stage, clocking 16 min. 24 sec.

North Staffs. and Stone were awarded the medals for the most meritorious performance. They improved from seventeenth to seventh position on last year's race.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPETITORS AND OFFICIALS

A letter from the Rt. Hon. Duncan M. Weatherstone, M.C., T.D., Lord Provost of Edinburgh, addressed to Peter L. Meldrum, the Rt. Hon. Lord Provost of Glasgow, will be handed to the first representative of Motherwell Y.M.C.A. H. (last year's winners) at the start by Bailie J. Slack of Edinburgh, and will be delivered to the Lord Provost of Glasgow's deputy, Bailie D. Docherty at the winning post.

All teams will carry a baton throughout the race (i.e. in the hand).

Any team falling 30 minutes behind the leading team will be taken out of the race.

Competitors' coaches, numbered as per relays 1-8 will take runners to their respective starting points, and pick them up again at the end of their relays. All competitors must travel in the official coaches.

All competitors, except those running the first relay, must be in their respective coaches, ready to start at 11.0 a.m. No competitor will be waited for. Only competitors and officials with Coach Tickets will be allowed to travel in the coaches.

To avoid congestion, no coaches must stop within 100 yards of each Take-Over. Coach drivers are asked by the Organisers to observe this request strictly.

Dressing facilities at the start: The Flora Stevenson School, Comely Bank.

The first ten teams to finish will qualify for next year's race. The remaining teams to be invited will be selected by the Scottish A.A.A. and S.N.C.C.U.

Immediately after the race, competitors and officials with Tea Tickets adjourn to the Ca'doro Restaurant, Union Street, Glasgow, for High Tea, where Bailie D. Docherty will present the Trophy and Medals to the winners.
