RELAYS AND EXCHANGE STATIONS

The runners, totalling 160, will be divided into eight relays of 20.

Each competitor must wear, **BACK AND FRONT**, the number and the letter shown in this programme.

News of the World arrow signs will be shown throughout the Course at all turns, and banners show each take-over.

- FIRST RELAY.** Starting from the Fettes College Gates in Carrington Road, run straight ahead turning right into East Fettes Avenue; then right into Comely Bank, Craighleith Road to Queensferry Road. Continue along Queensferry Road to Barnton roundabout, turning left down Maybury Road to join Main Glasgow Road at Maybury Cross. First take-over. Distance 5½ miles.

- SECOND RELAY.** Main Glasgow Road, left fork to Newbridge, over stone bridge, under viaduct, right fork by Broxburn A.A. box to Broxburn East U.F. Church. Distance: 11½ miles.

- THIRD RELAY.** Main Road to Uphall, right fork, sharp rise to Dechmont (switchback going) to Wester Dechmont Farm. Distance: 15½ miles.

1965 NATIONAL ROAD RELAY RACE (LONDON-BRIGHTON)

GODIVA RACE IN AGAIN

Reprinted from the News of the World, 11th April, 1965

COVENTRY GODIVA HARRIERS won the "News of the World" London to Brighton National Road Relay Race for the third time in succession after a close battle all the way.

Gordon Horne led Coventry home, finishing 14 seconds in front of Mike Deakin (Derby & County), North Staffs. and Stone were third.

40 yards behind.

Olympic Marathon silver medallist, Basil Heatley, ran the penultimate stage for Coventry and handed over to Horne, 40 yards behind Derby.

Running with great determination Horne chased Deakin and caught him after half a mile. Deakin tried several times to regain the lead, but Horne stayed ahead and made his effort one mile from the finish to win by 100 yards.

Coventry's overall time was 4 hrs. 26 mins. 11 secs., nearly seven minutes outside their own course record set last year.

Always in doubt

The lead changed on all but four of the 12 stages and the result was in doubt until the final leg.

At the finish only 12 minutes separated the first 17 teams, while at the halfway point seven minutes covered all 20.

Making their first appearance in the race, Hercules A.C. took the medals for the most meritorious performance.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPETITORS AND OFFICIALS

A letter from the Rt. Hon. Sir Duncan M. Weatherstone, M.C., T.D., Lord Provost of Edinburgh, addressed to the Rt. Hon. Lord Provost of Glasgow, will be handed to the first representative of Motherwell Y.M.C.A. H. (last year's winners) at the start by Bailie P. Wilson of Edinburgh, and will be delivered to the Lord Provost of Glasgow's deputy, Bailie M. Shinwell at the winning post.

Competitors must wear letter numbers back and front corresponding to the numbers allotted to them in this programme and their official club vest.

All teams will carry a baton throughout the race (i.e. in the hand).

Any team falling 30 minutes behind the leading team will be taken out of the race.

Competitors' coaches, numbered as per relays 1-8 will take runners to their respective starting points, and pick them up again at the end of their relays. All competitors must travel in the official coaches.

All competitors, except those running the first relay, must be in their respective coaches, ready to start at 11.0 a.m. No competitor will be waited for. Only competitors and officials with Coach Tickets will be allowed to travel in the coaches.

To avoid congestion, no coach may stop within 100 yards of each Take-Over. Coach drivers are asked by the Organisers to observe this request strictly.

Dressing facilities at the start: The Flora Stevenson School, Comely Bank, Edinburgh.

The first ten teams to finish will qualify for next year's race. The remaining teams to be invited will be selected by the Scottish A.A.A. and Scottish C.C.U.

The winning team will be invited to compete in the 1966 National (London—Brighton) Road Relay Race.

Immediately after the race, competitors and officials with Tea Tickets adjourn to the Ca'doro Restaurant, Union Street, Glasgow, for high tea, where Bailie M. Shinwell will present the Trophy and Medals to the winners.

NOTE—The police have given instructions that cars and coaches must not park less than half a mile beyond the first Take-over at Maybury Cross.
