TRIUMPH OF DUNDEE LADY HARRIERS

SCOTS INDIVIDUAL AND TEAM TITLES WON

Miss Mildred Storrar's Great Effort

THE triumph of Dundee Hawkhill Harriers in carrying off the Scottish women's cross-country championship at Bishopbriggs on Saturday brings the city right into the forefront of the sport.

Formed about five years ago, the ladies' section has come steadily forward. During the last three years the club have been runners-up to Maryhill, but on Saturday a splendid effort placed them on top in the individual and team placings.

The course, which was over $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles, was much more difficult than usual. The races in the past have been over racecourses, but this year the course included a ploughed field, ten fences, and a steep hill.

First Home

Miss Mildred Storrar, Hawkhill, was the first home, and covered the distance in 9 min. 46 sec. She breasted the tape one second before the internationalist, Miss Connie Johnson, of Maryhill.

The latter set the pace from the start, but about 250 yards from the finish Miss Storrar drew level and went on to win by two yards.

Miss Vera Murray, Miss Elsie Paterson, and Miss Bella Allan, the other members of the Dundee team, finished sixth, seventh, and ninth respectively.

Miss Storrar, who is 19 years of age, lives in Edinburgh. She joined up with Hawkhill Harriers in June of last year as there was no club in the capital.

Miss Allan and Miss Murray are also 19 and Miss Paterson 16.

Hopes for Summer

The club is hopeful of further success at the Scottish women's track championships at Glasgow in the summer.

TRIUMPH FOR DUNDEE

Hawkhill Ladies Land "Daily Record" Cross-Country Trophy

DUNDEE HAWKHILL were fully rewarded for their journey to Glasgow for the Scottish Women's A.A.A. cross-country championship on Saturday. In addition to depriving Maryhill of the handsome *Daily Record* team race trophy, they also provided the individual champion.

With a total aggregate of 23 points, the Dundee team beat Maryhill by fifteen points, with Shettleston Harriers third, nine points behind the runners-up. Clydesdale were fourth, and a disappointing Bellahouston quartette fifth.

Miss Mildred Storrar, Dundee Hawkhill, was expected to give Connie Johnson, Maryhill's champion, a tough challenge for the premier individual award, but most critics thought the experience of the holder would again prove too much for her rival.

About two hundred yards from the finish, however, the Dundonian moved up and passed the holder, and despite a determined effort by Connie Johnson, Miss Storrar drew away to win a thrilling race by five yards. Miss Jean Tait, Clydesdale, who was third, finished 160 yards behind the winner.

In presenting the prizes at Springburn Harriers' headquarters after the race, Mr. T. Birrell, the honorary president, emphasised the gratitude of the Womens' Association to the *Daily Record* for the trophy and medals. "The sport amongst the fair sex," added Mr. Birrell, "owes much of its success to the generous co-operation of the directors of that newspaper."

NORTHERN'S VICTORY

Edinburgh Northern easily won the third and last six miles Edinburgh and District League race at Kirkcaldy by a margin of 23 points over Kirkcaldy Y.M.C.A. Thus Northern won the George Sandilands Shield, as League champions for the ninth time—a sequence broken only once, by an Edinburgh Southern success.

Chief interest, of course, lay in the running of the three internationals, A. Dow, Y.M.C.A., the winner, J. P. Laidlaw and W. Hinde, Edinburgh Northern. The real surprise was the excellent running shown by D. Dewar, Kirkcaldy Y.M.C.A., who beat both Northern stars to finish second.
