SCOTTISH NEWS AND RESULTS

Jean Lorden New Scottish Champion

JEAN Lorden surprised a number of more fancied rivals to win the Scottish Senior CC title over a fast, scenic course interspersed with a few steep uphill and downhill stretches as well as an area of sandy seashore at the Beach Park, Irvine, on February 23rd. The 25-year-old Edinburgh Southern Harrier was one of a close-knit group including Christine Price, June Standing, Marcella Robertson and Penny Rother for the first two miles, but she steadily pulled away over the final 1½ to finish nine seconds clear of her nearest rival.

Miss Lorden, who was third in the Scottish 4000m 'Closed' Championship at Lochgelly two weeks earlier, led her club to victory in the team event and, along with runner-up Christine Price and third-placed June Standing, automatically qualified for Scotland's team for the World Championship. Less than half a minute separated the first five to finish, Marcella Robertson, a top-class orienteer, and Penny Rother occupying fourth and fifth positions respectively.

The 'Young Seniors' race, held in conjunction with the main event, was won by Kirsten Scobie, whose father, ex-Maryhill Harrier Brian, now coaches Glasgow Marathon victor Angela Pain, from McLaren Glasgow duo Gail Macdonald and Eileen Cochrane, whose club won the team title. The first Veteran to

finish was Kay Dobson in 37th place.

Morpeth Harriers from Northumberland have always competed with distinction at the Scottish Championships, and although they relinquished the team title which they won last year at Rosyth in the Intermediate category, they provided the winner in Lisa Reilly, the reigning champion and runner-up in the English Championship at Leicester seven days earlier. So convincing was Lisa's winning margin that she was 43 seconds clear of Frances Hillan, who in turn had nine seconds over Carol-Ann Bartlay, whose Victoria Park colleagues Hazel McHenry and Lindsey Campbell finished well up the field to give the Glasgow club victory in the team event in an age-group which they have dominated all season.

The Junior race over two miles was convincingly won by Hayley Haining, whose finishing speed was just too much for Marlene Gemmell and Mary McClung, who have both shown outstanding promise throughout the winter months. Morpeth lost their team title to Kilbarchan, who won their sixth consecutive Scottish championship in 18 months and have now not been defeated by any Scottish club for nearly two years in cross country and road team competitions.

SWCCU 'Closed' Champs

Held at Lochgelly on February 9th and raced over 4000m, the SWCCU 'Closed' Champs resulted in a win for Karen McLeod (EAC), in 16:07, from Penny Rother (EAC) 16:35 and Jean Lorden (ESH) 17:28. Edinburgh AC (15) won the team race from McLaren Glasgow (29) and Victoria Park (33). Further details awaited.

The Northumberland club were having mixed fortunes at Irvine, because despite providing the winner of the Girls' two miles race in Susan Priest—the reigning champion—and third placer Karen Foster, they could not finish a complete team and lost their title to another English club, Carlisle. First Scottish runner to finish was Dawn Simpson, who has dominated the domestic scene in the age-group this season.

The U/11 race over 1½ miles produced keen competition between Debbie McInally and Angela Foster, and although both shared the same time of 8:40, Debbie was awarded the verdict by the judges, which was no more than she deserved for being such a popular figure at cross country races throughout Scotland during the last few months. Carlisle won the team title much to the delight of manager Phil Nash, who has done sterling work over the years for athletics in the remote north-west corner of England.

The decision by the Scottish Women's CCU to make their championships open to clubs throughout the United Kingdom can only benefit the sport in Scotland, and secretary Mrs. June Ward is hoping that other English clubs will follow Morpeth and Carlisle and make regular excursions north of the border to

participate in top events.
