Notice to Competitors.

Rule 15.—No attendant shall accompany any Competitor on the Scratch or in the Race, nor shall a Competitor be allowed to receive assistance or refreshments from anyone during the progress of the Race. The Committee shall have full power to deal with any infringement of this Rule.

Rule 16.—All protests shall be made in writing to the Secretary before the prizes are presented, and must be accompanied by a deposit of 5/, which shall be forfeited if upon investigation it is found to have been made on no reasonable ground.

Secretaries of Clubs must declare Teams before receiving Competitors' numbers.

Competitors will pin the numbers prefixed to their names on the breast.

Competitors whose numbers are prefixed (*) are eligible to compete for Junior Championship Medal.

The numbers after the Competitors names indicate their position in last year's race.

Competitors are requested not to leave any valuables in their pockets whilst taking part in the contest.

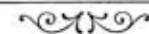

THE LUMLEY SHIELD, value 65 Guineas

(Presented by F. A. LUMLEY, Esq., Edinburgh and Glasgow),

Is a splendid specimen of repousse work, being of solid silver, with the four National Emblems (Rose, Shamrock, Thistle, and Prince of Wales' Feathers), in enamel on gilt discs. Scrolls are at the sides for the names of the winning country and the six men who count for them. The whole is enclosed in a fumed oak air-tight case with a bronze ornament mounted on top.

This Shield will be competed for at FIFTH INTERNATIONAL CROSS-COUNTRY CONTEST, to be held at GLASGOW, on SATURDAY, 23rd MARCH, 1907, by Teams representing England (Holders), Ireland, Scotland, Wales, and France.
