# Cambuslang to fore

Helped by a splendid last 5½-mile stage from Alex Gil-mour, Cambuslang Harriers won the Scottish National sixstage relay for the first time at Strathclyde Park yesterday.

Gilmour overtook Keith Lyall on the last stage to end the unbeaten record of Edinburgh Southern Harriers over this course. Southern had led for the previous three stages having been put there by Colin Hume who had the fastest time on the third lap of 17.56 for the shorter stage.

Craig Hunter and John Wheeler kept the East side to the fore but Gilmour stormed home in 26.58 which gave him a winning margin of 41 seconds over Southern with Spango Valley in third place.

Rod Stone had brought Cambuslang up from sixth to third place on the third stage. Ed Stuart, with an identical time to Gilmour, took them into second place on the fourth lap.

Harriers, Bellahouston though leading after the first stage thanks to Peter Fleming (17.58), were never the antici-pated threat as neither Andy Daly nor George Braidwood turned out.

# Gilmour's attack takes the team title

THE tenacity of Alex Gilmour gave Cambuslang their first national six-stage relay title national six-stage relay title yesterday at Strathclyde Park, (writes Doug Gillon). He produced a stunning anchor leg to give his club victory by 41 seconds, in 2hrs 17mins 45secs. Second were Edinburgh Southern Harriers with Spango Valley third in 2-19-12 in 2-19-12.

Southern appeared to be coasting to victory when Gilmour set off 66 seconds behind Keith Lyall. But the Irvine electrician got wired in, plugging away steadily and finally, if you pardon the persistent metaphor, defused the capital threat.

Even without the services of Scotland's fastest marathon man, Alistair Hutton, world crosscountry duo John Robson and Neil national the Tennant. championship medallist Calum Henderson, who refuses to compete on a Sunday, Southern appeared in control as Lyall set off. But Gilmour was having none of it. The six-stage title - three legs of just over three miles alternating with three of nearly six miles - had never been won by his club.

31-year-old Gilmour, The in the national twelfth while championships still recovering from ankle injury, thus missed the world event in Neuchetel last weekend. "I've had a disappointing cross-country season," he said. "But this helps make up for it.

Now he will attempt to gain selection for the 10,000 metres at the Commonwealth Games. His clubmate, Tom Ulliot had taken Cambuslang into tenth place of the 69 teams after the opening leg, and steady consistent performances throughout put Gilmour in the position to attack in the end.

Glenpark's Tommy Murray — "I don't think my face fits with the selectors," - let his feet do the talking, his time of 26 min 33 sec. being the fastest six mile leg. Next fastest overall, also on the second stage, was Laurie Spence (Spango Valley) at 26,36, taking the Greenock club from twelfth to fourth. ## Cambuslang Snatch Title From Southern

THIS year's Scottish National Six Man Road Relay, with alternate short and long laps of 3.8 and 5.7 miles, reverted to its traditional venue around Strathclyde Park Loch on Easter Sunday, and provided an exciting contest with the outcome decided only in the final mile. Alec Gilmour overtook Edinburgh Southern's Keith Lyall to provide Cambuslang with their first win in the event, while third placed Spango Valley repeated their 1985 performance. Although Southern were without their talented quartet of Hutton, Robson, Tennant and Henderson, other clubs also had key runners missing, but such is the depth of the Edinburgh pool they were still able to put out a team which almost won the day.

#### Stage One

The opening short leg turned out to be a one man procession as Peter Fleming pulled away from his 68 rivals on the gradual climb around the one mile mark and was thereafter never headed. His 17:58 gave the defending champions a comfortable lead of 32 seconds over formidable Veteran Adrian Weatherhead, who got the better of his younger Edinburgh rival, Tom Hanlon, by two seconds, with Shettleston's Brian Scally a further nine seconds adrift in fourth. Of the other fancied teams, Springburn were eighth due to a fine 18:56 from late stand-in Alec Chalmers, nine seconds and two places in front of Cambuslang's Tom Ulliott.

#### Stage Two

As expected this was the see-saw stage, with Bellahouston and Shettleston dropping back to fifth and seventh respectively and Edinburgh Southern pushed back to eighth through a below-par performance from Neil Thin (27:54). Clearly the outstanding act came from the much improved Tommy Murray, whose 26:33 was to be the day's fastest and took the lead for Greenock Glenpark. Murray, is in only his second year of running and is certainly one to watch for in the future. Edinburgh AC maintained second through Lindsay Robertson (27:02), with Graham Crawford (27:00) advancing Springburn to third ahead of Spango, for whom Lawrie Spence had delivered a characteristically gutsy contribution of 26:36 to prise open a 16 seconds gap over Cambuslang.

Southern made a surprise move by fielding their top runner, Colin Hume, on the middle short stage; a decision which may, arguably, have cost them the race. Steeplechaser Hume promptly uncorked a sparkling 17:56, the day's fastest, to give his club an eight seconds advantage over Spango's Chris Leck, while Rod Stone slotted Cambuslang into third, 20 seconds ahead of Springburn. At the halfway point, it was clear that the eventual winners would emerge from one of these four clubs. Greenock Glenpark were still excelling in fifth, although Bellahouston, Edinburgh AC and Shettleston continued to lose ground.

Glenpark were still a defiant fifth ahead of the advancing Kilbarchan, whose cause had been ably assisted by Alan Puckrin (27:02).

#### Stage Six


Keith Lyall set off on what appeared to most observers to be the 'glory' leg for Southern, but a close study of recent results would have indicated a question mark over his form; whereas there were no doubts as to the current fitness of his pursuer, Alec Gilmour. The 31-year-old Cambuslang runner, knowing that his rear was secure, decided 'to go out hard over the first three miles and see what might happen'. What did happen was that Gilmour relentlessly reeled Lyall in, and then with just over a mile remaining sped by his helpless rival and in turn built up a lead of over 200m by the finish. In spite of having just come off night shift and with only four hours sleep under his belt, the Cambuslang man still managed to post the fastest final stage time of 26:58, five seconds quicker than Royal Navy runner Chris

Robison, who anchored Spango into third place ahead of Springburn and Motherwell. Kilbarchan were a safe sixth while the next three — East Kilbride, Teviotdale (an impressive 27:32 last leg from Alan Walker) and Greenock Glenpark — can be well pleased with their efforts.
